And the scammers ALMOST ALWAYS tell their victim "Don't tell anyone about this. NO ON E!"

Do NOT give in to being bullied, yelled at, or other tactics meant to rush you into the wrong action.

And call your *real* family member to confirm where they are and what they are doing. Chances are, they'll have no clue about their so-called 'emergency situation.'

Registration ends October 13th
