In just the past year, we made 958 loans totaling 21.4 million dollars to

our members. Your credit union has consistently outpaced its peer group of credit unions in membership and loan growth. We couldn't do it without the support of our members. Thank you!

As the landscape evolves, so does the threat of fraud to our members. According to Federal Trade Commission data, U.S. consumers lost more than \$12.5 billion to fraud in 2024, an increase of 25% over the previous year. The FTC received more than 71,000 fraud reports from people in Illinois. The top fraud category in Illinois was online shopping. Other top fraud categories included: business imposters, government imposters, employment scams, and fraud related to phone devices, accessories, and services. At TCCU, we remain vigilant in protecting our members against fraud. You can help protect yourself by monitoring your accounts regularly and not giving out your personal information. Never trust a link that is texted or emailed to you from an unknown source. If you are unsure if something is legitimate, give us a call and we can help.

We wish all of you the best and hope you enjoy this beautiful time of year. Whenever you need us, TCCU will be here for you. Thank you to all our members, employees, and directors for making TCCU such a great place.

2024 SUCCESSES FEATURED AT ANNUAL MEETING

As has become a trend, TCCU's recent annual meeting highlighted yet another banner year of growth and success for the credit union and its members.

Year-end totals show that TCCU closed 2024 with:

- 1.28% growth in membership
 up to 7,351 members
- We rank in the 75th percentile of our peer group in membership growth
- \$62.8 million in total loans
- Loan growth of 3.82%, which ranks us in the 73rd percentile of our group
- o 958 loans approved in 2024, totaling \$21.4 million

According to TCCU President, Will Perkins, "Our members helped drive our success, and we will continue to prove ourselves worthy of their trust in us.

"The TCCU Board of Directors, staff and management know that our members drive this organization. Their financial needs and concerns are what we strive to fulfill day in and day out, and to continue to earn their trust and loyalty."

STAY ALERT AGAINST FRAUD

With instances of financial fraud increasing daily around the globe, we want to remind our members there are some easy steps to help protect yourself and your financial information and accounts.

- 1. Immediately report lost or stolen credit cards to TCCU.
- 2. Cover the ATM PIN pad when entering your number.
- 3. Choose a credit and debit card PIN that is difficult to guess ... but that is easy for you to remember.
- 4. Do NOT reply to any email, text or phone requests for your Social Security number, credit or debit card account number or any other personal information.
- Monitor your credit report, credit and debit card accounts and statements for any unauthorized transactions.
- 6. Shred all credit and debit card statements or financial documents before you throw them away.
- Before making purchases online with your credit or debit card, make sure the website is secure, and the company is reputable.
- 8. Update anti-virus and spyware software regularly.

It doesn't take professional scammers/fraudsters much time to steal your information. Just as it really doesn't take *you* much time to take steps to guard against their efforts.
